Lodging and Travel

We have booked a block of rooms in the Aloft Minneapolis, at 900 Washington Avenue South, Minneapolis, MN 55415. A modern hotel about a half mile (about a twenty-minute walk, five minutes by shuttle van) from the University of Minnesota School of Music, Aloft is in the trendy Mill District, just a block from the Guthrie Theater. The price for rooms (for one or two persons, and including breakfast and internet access) is \$109 per night. For reservations, please call 1-888-627-7079. When making reservations, ask for the University of Minnesota/Mozart Society of America rate. Reservations should be made before 30 September.
